Level 4 – Eliminate Likely that disease is not contained	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sustained and intensive transmission Widespread outbreaks 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> People instructed to stay home Educational facilities closed Businesses closed except for essential services and lifeline utilities Rationing of supplies and requisitioning of facilities Travel severely limited Major reprioritisation of healthcare services 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All office-based staff to work from home Offices closed to staff except for staff required to support essential urgent services, and only one at a time to ensure physical distancing. Supports only provided where essential and urgent, and where no other option is available PPE worn for all supports
Level 3 – Restrict Heightened risk that disease is not contained	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Community transmission occurring OR Multiple clusters break out 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Travel in areas with clusters or community transmission limited Affected educational facilities closed Mass gatherings cancelled Public venues closed Alternative ways of working required, and some non-essential businesses should close Non face-to-face primary care consultations Non acute (elective) services and procedures in hospitals deferred and healthcare staff reprioritised 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All office-based staff to work from home with exception of those required to support essential services. Where access to office is required this will be rostered and managed. Supports only provided when essential or urgent. That is – supports that PWS cannot live without PPE worn for all close-contact interactions with PWS
Level 2 – Reduce Disease is contained, but risks of community transmission growing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> High risk of importing COVID-19 OR Uptick in imported cases OR Uptick in household transmission OR Single or isolated cluster outbreak 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Entry border measures maximised Further restrictions on mass gatherings Physical distancing on public transport (e.g. leave the seat next to you empty) Limit non-essential travel around NZ Employers start alternative ways of working if possible (e.g. remote working, shift-based working, physical distancing in workplace, staggering meal breaks, flexible leave arrangements) Business continuity plans activated High risk people advised to remain at home (e.g. those over 70 or those with existing medical conditions) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Offices closed to public access All office-based staff over 70 years of age to work from home All support workers over 70 to cease providing supports All staff with existing medical conditions or who are immune compromised to work from home if possible or take special leave if not. No non-essential travel to occur Physical distancing within the workplace occurs
Level 1 – Prepare Disease is contained	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Heightened risk of importing COVID-19 OR Sporadic imported cases OR Isolated household transmission associated with imported cases 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Border entry measures to minimise risk of importing COVID-19 cases applied Contact tracing Stringent self-isolation and quarantine Intensive testing for COVID-19 Physical distancing encouraged Mass gatherings over 500 cancelled Stay home if you're sick, report flu-like symptoms Wash and dry hands, cough into elbow, don't touch your face 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Employees self-isolate when returning from overseas for 14 days No domestic or international air travel No large meetings Trainings postponed or cancelled Employees advised not to attend community meetings
